Associate MFT /PCC Training Announcement

This is a paid part time or full time position for a post-masters graduate looking to fulfill the requirements for licensure for marriage and family therapist or professional clinical counselor (MFT/PCC). In this position the associate will shadow the psychologist to observe how interviews are conducted, learn about the field of forensic psychology, learn about trauma, and gain experience by reviewing old case files. The associate may have the opportunity to observe the psychologist testifying. The associate may be permitted to interview clients, and will learn interviewing techniques and about testing protocols with the psychologist in team meetings. If the associate speaks more than one language, the associate may assist in conducting interviews. The associate will also be required to assist with administrative duties as needed. The associate will have various practice projects to display a level of retention of learned material. The associate will see between 10 and 20 clinical clients per week depending if they are part time or full time.

Benefits

Benefits to the Profession and the Public. This associateship will provide a commencement or enhancement experience to the field of clinical and forensic psychology with an emphasis in trauma. In addition to providing needed experience for future mental health professionals, F.I.R.E. Professional Growth and Development. This associateship will provide professional growth and development by assisting the associate with development of resume/curriculum vitae, personal statements for doctorate programs, and interviewing techniques. Requirements

This is a paid part-time or full-time position with compensation commensurate with experience. The candidate must have a graduate degree with least a 3.3 "major" grade point average on a 4.0 scale and a 3.0 "overall" grade point average on a 4.0 scale. An unofficial transcript must be provided along with answering the following questions in two pages or less: 1. Why do you want to learn about forensic psychology? 2. What do you know about trauma? 3. What are you hoping to gain from the position? 4. Are you able to commute? 5. What hours and days are you most available (note Mondays are mandatory for supervision)?
